Illness and Strep A

We are currently experiencing high levels of illness in both schools and there is understandable concern about the tragic deaths of several children nationally with Strep A infections. Please do not send your child to school if they are unwell or have a high temperature. At both schools we continue to encourage good respiratory and hand hygiene to help prevent the spread of infections.

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has issued some guidance with regards to Strep A infections and it provides good advice on symptoms and when to seek medical advice. https://www.gov.uk/government/news/ukhsa-update-on-scarlet-fever-and-invasive-group-a-strep.

Scarlet fever is usually a mild illness and it is very rare that the bacteria causes the serious illness called invasive Group A strep (iGAS). However, it is important everyone is aware of symptoms, which include a sore throat, headache, and fever, along with a fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel, and please keep your child(ren) away from school if they are unwell. Please make sure you inform us if your child develops Scarlet fever so we can take steps to control any potential outbreak.

Attendance Overview (update) and new policy from Jan 23

The DfE have recently issued very comprehensive guidance on the importance of regular school attendance and its correlation with success in school and ultimately, qualifications like GCSE and 'A' levels. The latest percentages by class are below, (a reminder that caution needs to be taken with data of this type – i.e. number of children in the class, age of children etc however, it's a good indicator).

LSP have now issued a revised Attendance policy and Governors approved the policy at the LGB meeting on Monday this week. We will post the policy on the website (which will be in effect from the start of T3) and Mr Marriott will share some of the key changes before the end of this term via email.

Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence may seriously affect their learning. The Department for Education (DfE) defines a pupil as a 'persistent absentee' when they miss 10% or more schooling across the school year, for whatever reason. The table below indicates how what might seem like just a few days of absence can result in children missing a significant number of lessons.

*One session is one half day i.e. there are two sessions

Within the new policy, where there are continued concerns about a pupil's attendance which are not resolved informally, parents/carers may be asked to meet with the school to discuss the matter more formally. In some cases, this may result in a formal action plan being produced. The school may also invite other involved professionals, where relevant. Also, where a pupil has a high level and/or frequency of absence, LSP may require suitable evidence in order to authorise any future absence where illness has been given as the reason. If this is the case, the school will make the parent/carers aware of this expectation in advance.
