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### Introduction from Philip Gladwin – Chair of Governors

Hello! I am Philip Gladwin the new Chair of Governors for Bishop Sutton and Stanton Drew Primary schools and am writing to introduce myself and explain the work the team of Governors do to support your children at school.

I am a Dad of two and have been a school Governor since 2014. Both my children attended Stanton Drew before joining Chew Valley. I work for the NHS as a Data Analyst. Outside of work I enjoy CrossFit at the Cattle Market in Winford, try to get around the Chew Valley 10K each year, and am a member of the bell ringing group in Stanton Drew.

Behind the scenes Governors are working hard. We are a group of currently eight parents and members of the community who work as volunteers to ensure the children receive the best possible education. We meet regularly with senior leaders and members of staff from the Lighthouse Schools Partnership (LSP) and challenge the senior leadership team on a wide range of topics. Recently we have: -

- Agreed the financial budget for the year ahead and meet with the business manager throughout the year to keep the budget on track
- The safeguarding Governor meets with Mr. Cook regularly to understand the work that staff do to support any children who are experiencing difficulties
- Reviewed and updated relevant policies for the school. Many of these are available on the school website
- Attended a review day with LSP and members of teaching staff to scrutinize the work children are doing in English
- The Health and Safety Governor is preparing an audit
- Last but not least we are preparing for an OFSTED inspection so that we are ready to respond to their questions when they call...!

I hope this has gone some way to demystifying the work that we do. Finally, I would like to acknowledge the work that Simon Waller did as the previous Chair and make a commitment to continue the work he started.
