## **Update from our SENCo**

We are committed to meeting the needs of all our children at Bishop Sutton and Stanton Drew. Supporting children's individual needs is very much a team effort, with Class Teachers, support staff, SENCo, and senior leaders all having an important part to play.

Please remember that your child's Class Teacher should always be your first point of contact, as they hold the day-to-day information on what is happening in class.

## <u>Updating IEPs (individual support / learning plans)</u>

Those children who have an identified additional need, and need support which is additional to and different from our Universal Provision (available to all children), will be on our SEND register.

They will have an individual support / learning plan, which will outline what is in place to support them - including universal strategies, group interventions and more specific tailored support.

Those children whose needs are being met within our Universal Provision will not need an individual plan, but if there is an identified need then they will remain on our monitoring list.

The individual plans are usually updated in Terms 1, 3 and 5, and Class Teachers alongside myself are in the process of updating these for the Autumn Terms. We are still learning how to make the most of the new Provision Map system (which is being used across LSP schools) in writing and sharing this information - please do bear with us.

Class Teachers will be sharing these plans with relevant parents by the end of **Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> October**. Please do contact your child's Class Teacher following this if you would like to discuss this further.


