
















Microsoft Team Parent Training

Dear Parents

Welcome back! I hope that you enjoyed a good half term holiday and that the children enjoyed the break.

The term ahead

As I hinted at in a recent message, it is undoubtedly going to be a challenging term ahead of us. There is nothing more than I want than for all children to be in school enjoying their lessons and break times and playing with their friends. Neither though does anyone want to see pupils or staff put in harm's way. As infection rates increase across communities it seems inevitable that more staff will be forced to isolate at home, making it increasingly likely that more schools will be forced to close for some period of time. This week for the first time since the pandemic started, the rate of infection in B&NES is higher than the national average – with infections across all age groups. However, if we all continue to be careful and vigilant, we may be able to avoid closing bubbles. We need all parents to support us with the measures that we already have in place, as well as being mindful of the 'face, hands, space' message, and being swift in taking action and informing us if children or members of their household display symptoms. That way we can keep our communities as safe as possible - and reduce the potential risk of having to close bubbles. We will also need to continue to be slightly 'overcautious' in terms of any symptoms that children display; this will be more challenging as we approach the colder weather.

MS Teams

This week, most of you will have been able to speak to your child's teacher as part of Parents' Evenings; if this is not the case please message the teacher on Classdojo to arrange an alternative appointment. Please also remember that the log in details for MS Teams are really important and will be needed if we go to a lengthy closure (2 weeks+) of a bubble or a wider closure. Mr Marriott will be offering some MS Teams training for parents over the next few days – watch out for details.

Ventilation

We have received additional guidance on ventilation as well as the colder weather approaches. Both staff and children need to be working in comfortable conditions but ventilation of indoor spaces is still a necessary strategy to reduce risk. The short version is that we will have windows open for the foreseeable future to allow added ventilation and then as each class is cleaned during the day, we'll open the windows and doors further. This means that children may well need to wear an added layer to keep them warm e.g. a t-shirt under a polo shirt.

Website

Also previously mentioned was the change in website provider to E4 Education. This work should synchronize over the weekend with Monday 9th November being the date that the new website goes live - the website address remains the same apparently! This is a requirement of the LSP MAT, and if I am honest, not a job that has been top of my recent priority list. However, we are hoping for a smooth transition and that all the information transfers correctly.

And finally...

The staff are working tremendously hard to make sure that children are happy and engaged in their learning and enjoying playing with their friends. Life in school is not back to normal and we are faced everyday with new significant challenges as well as the 'day job'. Your support and understanding whilst we move through this next

phase are greatly appreciated. As we start this new term, I would like to thank all the staff who have worked
extremely hard to make sure that we try to keep school as safe as possible and give the children the best educational
experience possible. Although we don't know how things will develop over the next few months, I believe that the
last few months has shown us the power of working really closely together for the benefit of everyone in our
community, which it remains a privilege to serve at such an important time.
