#### Social Media



Unfortunately, there have been a couple of cases of inappropriate social media messages at other schools across the Trust recently and I am aware that perhaps very occasionally parents/carers at Bishop Sutton may have used social media or chat groups to complain about the school or make inappropriate comments about staff, other parents or children. As a school, we want our children to grow

into respectful young people, who understand how to settle differences in a respectful and constructive manner, both online and offline. There may be times where, as a parent, you don't agree with or understand something the school is doing, or where you may have specific concerns. We welcome your feedback, and the opportunity to address any concerns you may have.

The most appropriate way to raise concerns is directly with the school, in line with our communication and complaints procedures. Airing complaints or negative opinions on social media doesn't help the school to address the issue in the most constructive way (and of course we do not know about the concern if it is aired on social media/chat groups)!

You can call the school and speak to a member of staff, or book an appointment to speak with the Headteacher or another member of staff face-to-face.

We would therefore politely remind parents not to use social media to make comments about our school – please contact us if you need to speak to us about anything. We appreciate your help in providing a supportive, respectful environment for all our children, parents and staff.

## **Parking Near the School**

Below is part of a letter from one of our neighbours about the parking problems near the school. Please could everyone be mindful of parking legally and safely when dropping or collecting children.

"I live in Parkfield Gardens near the school, and we have a problem with cars parking across the junction at the end of our road where it joins Wick Road. I believe that this is parking related to the school, as it is only an issue during school time and I see lots of parents parking there to pick up their children for example.

It is quite hard to describe in an email, but cars park along Wick Road opposite the junction with Parkfield Gardens on the side of the road if you were driving towards the school. This means that as you pull out of the junction from Parkfield Gardens you might pull out with traffic coming towards you from the right with nowhere to pull into on the other side of the road to get out of their way. This is clearly dangerous, and I have had some near misses there.

I would be very grateful if it could perhaps be highlighted to people accessing the school that this parking is causing problems for people living in Parkfield Gardens. I appreciate it's difficult and finding places to park around schools can be hard, but unfortunately I do think that parking in this part of the road is dangerous for the reasons above and I worry there could be an accident there as things stand."
