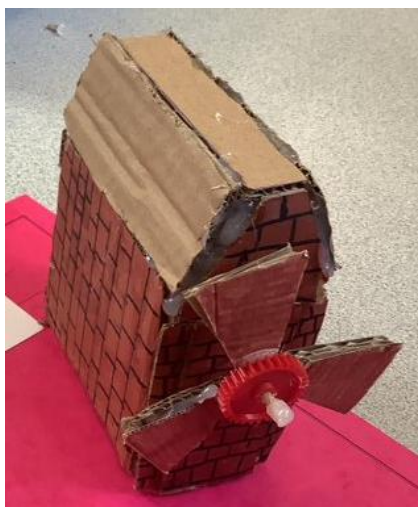


Year 2

Children currently in Year 2 will no longer receive free school meals from September. Please ensure you have funds on your Aspens account for school dinners. Thank you.

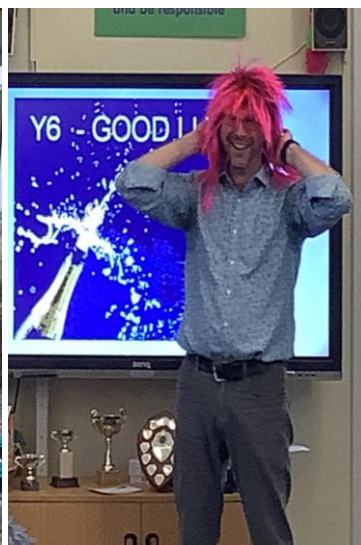
Lemurs
