

<u>First Access – Music Tuition</u>

Hopefully your child/children have been coming home on a Thursday afternoon and sharing their learning of how to play djembe drums with a lovely teacher Lisa Cherian, this is a new experience for Year 3 and a chance to perfect our skills for Years 4, 5, 6. We will be working towards a performance later in the year.

This really is a fantastic opportunity for the children; for the families new to KS2, the authority provides the instruments for the year completely free of charge and we are responsible for covering the cost of the tuition. The program has now changed name and it is called First Access music.

This year, if possible, your contribution for each child will be £22. Your child will be given the chance to actively engage with music, learn music notation and rhythms play alongside others and be given the chance to perform. Learning an instrument has been proven to enhance academic development. Hopefully the children will develop a hobby that they can pick up again at Secondary school and continue to enjoy for many years.


