As part of the nation's celebrations over the weekend, we would like the children to wear red, white and blue on Friday 5th May. We will have an in-school assembly to mark the occasion and then finish the day with a cake sale. (More details to follow after the holiday).

Sports Day – Wed 14th or 28th June

Our Sports Day this year will be held on 14th June at Bishop Sutton FC (with 28th June set as a reserve date). Because of the number of children in school now - 182, we are changing the format slightly so that there will be less waiting time for children between races. The morning races will start at 10am and will only involve KS2 children (parents welcome to attend). We will then have a lunch time where all children will be at the football ground with parents invited to join them for a picnic lunch and then the afternoon will be EYFS and KS1 races (parents welcome to attend). Our Y6 children will be supporting during the whole day as Playleaders.

Open School

Our next Open School day session is Monday 22nd May at 2.45pm. Similar to the last time, please do come in and chat to the children about their work/progress in their classrooms; gates will open at 2.40pm. (Children will be in their classes until the usual finish time of 3.10pm and be dismissed as usual).

Strike Action

After recent discussions, the NEU has rejected the offer made; other unions have yet to make their position clear. I suspect that this may mean further action (i.e. class/school closures) in the year although at the time of writing, no dates have been set. When I saw the headline figure, it seemed at least that there was an offer on the table; but the 'devil is in the detail', and within the 4.5% average proposed pay rise, only 0.5% of this would be funded by the DfE, leaving 4% to come from existing school budgets. Clearly, the DfE have not properly understood the real financial situation that schools are in, nor have they recognised the strength of feeling amongst school leaders and teachers in relation to the call for fair funding for schools (the very reason why so many teachers have been striking)! Watch this space.

Ruth Perry

In the last newsletter, I wrote about the joys - and challenges - of being a parent. It's probably fair to say that the same applies to being a school leader of course. I'm sure many of you will have heard/read the recent sad news regarding Ruth Perry who was the Headteacher at Caversham Primary School in Reading. Our thoughts are very much with the staff, children, parents and local community at her school, as well of course with Ruth's family. You may also have seen the media coverage around OfSTED inspections and a summary one-word judgement on schools. It's

impossible to sum up a school in a single word. There's an interesting article here from 24th March which discusses the really important information that parents want to know - are our children cared for by talented and dedicated teachers who are committed to helping children become responsible, happy members of society with bright futures? As a father with three grown-up children, and as a Headteacher of nearly 20 years, I'm very clear where my educational principles and priorities lie and agree with that sentiment; education is about nurturing children to be decent, kind and caring human beings.
